Abstract Format

The abstract must be in a Microsoft Word document and must not be longer than 350 words.

The abstract should be structured with:

- Title
- Objective or Hypothesis
- Methods
- Results
- Conclusion

Submission Components

1. List of author(s), with academic degrees and affiliation(s)
2. List any relevant conflicts of interest, or state "The author(s) have no relevant conflicts of interest."
3. Presenter's name and whether they are a faculty member, fellow, resident, student, or other (specify)
4. Willingness to accept either an oral or a poster presentation
